



# Grade Report for 2Ls & Graduates

The University of Tulsa College of Law uses a letter grading system for evaluating classroom performance. Grades range from A to F. Passing a course requires a grade of D-, and a student must maintain a 2.00 cumulative grade point average to graduate.

Students who list their actual GPAs must report the grade to two decimal points. Students may not round their GPAs. The GPA listed must be the most current GPA as reported on the student's grade report. In calculating a grade average, points are assigned as follows:

<b>A</b>	<b>4.00</b>	<b>C</b>	<b>2.00</b>
<b>A-</b>	<b>3.75</b>	<b>C-</b>	<b>1.75</b>
<b>B+</b>	<b>3.50</b>	<b>D+</b>	<b>1.50</b>
<b>B</b>	<b>3.00</b>	<b>D</b>	<b>1.00</b>
<b>B-</b>	<b>2.75</b>	<b>D-</b>	<b>0.50</b>
<b>C+</b>	<b>2.50</b>	<b>F</b>	<b>0.00</b>

A letter average may be used in lieu of a numerical GPA. Students should indicate their letter average according to the following range:

<b>A-</b>	<b>3.51-3.75</b>	<b>C-</b>	<b>1.51-1.75</b>
<b>B+</b>	<b>3.01-3.50</b>	<b>D+</b>	<b>1.01-1.50</b>
<b>B</b>	<b>2.76-3.00</b>	<b>D</b>	<b>0.51-1.00</b>
<b>B-</b>	<b>2.51-2.75</b>	<b>D-</b>	<b>0.01-0.50</b>
<b>C+</b>	<b>2.01-2.50</b>	<b>F</b>	<b>0.00</b>

Students may also include seminar papers, published writing, honorary organizations, CALI Awards for receiving the highest grade in the class, and other awards for academic excellence on their resumes.

The Dean and the Faculty Committee on Grades have approved for release the following grade percentiles for students completing the first and second year of study, respectively, as of May 2018:

**Top 25% 3.56**  
**Top 50% 3.13**

**2Ls**  
**Top 25% 3.64**  
**Top 50% 3.29**

**Graduates**  
**Top 25% 3.61**  
**Top 50% 3.27**

1Ls consist of all students who have earned between 18 and 31 credit hours:

2Ls includes all students who have earned over 31 credit hours but not eligible to graduate: and

Graduates include those students eligible to graduate in December 2017, May 2018, or August 2018. Students must have 88 credit hours to graduate.
